**Members elect new GVTC board of director at 2015 Annual Meeting**

SMITHSON VALLEY, July 2, 2015 — Mike Scott is GVTC's newest board of director. Mr. Scott represents District II, Position 4, which covers the Bulverde area. Scott was elected at GVTC's Annual Meeting, on June 25. He ran unopposed and replaces Janna Klein who chose not to seek reelection. Ms. Klein was appointed as a director in 2005 and elected as secretary/treasurer in 2013.
